FR. ADTODIO BAROL'S MESSAGE FOR SUDDAY - AUGUST 21ST, 2022

Dear sisters/brothers, parishioners of St. Thomas More and St. Bernadette,

I would like to use the letter to the Hebrews to greet you this weekend, taken from our second reading; "Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as children; for what child is there whom a father does not discipline? Therefore lift your dropping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed."

The message of this letter to the Hebrew is reminding us to endure trials and difficulties in life because they are part of our human journey and that God wills it to strengthen us in order that we become strong and be able to withstand difficulties when we strive to enter the narrow door that leads to eternal life in heaven. Some people would take any difficulties as a punishment from God but for those who know God will take it as an act of God's love to his children because it serves as a reminder that God wants his children to spend with Him in eternity.

The first reading from Prophet Isaiah reminds us that all peoples of the earth are God's beloved children and his prophecy came into reality when Christ the Emmanuel came into the world to live among his people and Jesus the Messiah taught us to call God, Father when he taught his disciples how to pray. Prophet Isaiah said, "For I know their works and their thoughts, and I am coming to gather all nations and tongues; and they shall come and shall see my glory, and I will set a sign among them." The first sign that God showed his people was a young virgin to conceive and give birth to a Son, and Jesus showed himself as the way, the truth and the life. Cont'd/over

So I learned to send them ahead of time. In this life's journey to eternal life, Jesus warned us to travel light because the door to heaven is narrow so it is best to leave things behind and Jesus had said, "how hard it is for a rich person to enter eternal life" We may recall the story of the lawyer who asked Jesus how to inherit eternal life and he was thinking that knowing the commandments of God would be enough, but Jesus challenged him to do them and since in his mind neighbor is a fellow Jew. Jesus told him about the good Samaritan story pointing out that a neighbor is the person in need as demonstrated by the Samaritan, as opposed to the priest and the Levite who also knew the law but was not able to put them into action for they were caught up with the notion of salvation as for the Jew only and so they have to limit their love to their fellow Jew as their only neighbor. To another who wanted to follow Jesus, he said, go sell all your possessions then come follow me. The young man walked away sad for he had many possessions.

Once again Jesus is asking each one of us where our treasure is because where our treasures are there our hearts will be also. Let us pray that we do not become greedy with material possessions to the point of losing sight of eternal life because our journey to eternal life does not require material wealth but spiritual wealth that no thief can take it away, or moth can destroy them. As I mentioned before our being increases not by what we possess but by what we have given away. Therefore, let us travel light with material possessions and let us fill our life with spiritual wealth by sharing what we have because at the end of our journey, we will be judged not of our possessions but what we have done with what we have in order to help our needy sisters and brothers who are our neighbor. We have to leave our heavy baggage of wealth and possessions and travel light with spiritual ammunition, of faith, hope and love. Please, stay safe and healthy at all times. Fr. Tony.
