FR. ADTODIO BAROL'S MESSAGE FOR SUDDAY - OCTOBER 16TH, 2022

Dear sisters/brothers, parishioners of St. Thomas More and St. Bernadette,

Our entrance antiphon this Sunday is indeed a very appropriate statement that relates with our readings, from Psalm 16: "To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; and hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me." As I mentioned that in order to increase our faith, we should devote some time in prayer because it is already a sign that we believe and that the more time we devote in prayer the more our faith grows stronger especially as Jesus said to pray always and not to lose heart. We have to use all the means that we know in order to have a close encounter with God who listens and answers our prayers.

In the first reading from the Book of Exodus, we learn that in order to occupy the land promised to the Israelites they have to fight those who would oppose them. The Amalekites tried to prevent the people of Israel to occupy their place, so the Israelites had to fight against them. Moses told Joshua to select some men to fight while he will be praying for them on a hill overlooking the battlefield. Whenever his hands were raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning and when they were down, the enemy was winning; so Aaron and Ur, helped Moses in raising his hands up until sundown and the Israelites won the day. They believed that God is fighting the battle with them, but they had to do their part, to put an army and to pray.

In the gospel Jesus is giving us the lesson to be persistent in prayer and not give up easily, when he told the parable of the widow who kept coming to the unjust judge demanding that she be given justice against her opponent. During the time of Jesus judges were considered corrupt and notorious and could be bribed in order to get a favorable verdict, they were called 'robber judges'. The widow was the symbol of all who were poor and defenceless, she had no money to bribe the judge, but she only had one weapon, persistence. Jesus had said, ask and it shall be given to you seek and you shall find, knock and the door will be opened for you.

It is easy to be disheartened and to give up when we feel our prayers are not answered as if God is sleeping or doesn't care about our pleas. One reason is that we expect God to answer our prayers as soon as possible. Let us be aware that God listens and answers our prayers but not according to our terms, our timetable and according to what we had planned. As a loving Father, a father has to refuse the request of a child, because he knows that what the child asks would hurt rather than help. God is like that. We do not know what is to happen in the next hour, let alone the next week, or month, or year. Only God sees time whole, and, therefore, only God knows what is good for us in the long run. We should not lose hope but continue believing because prayer is a means by which we grow in relationship with God, and it is surely transformative. We might not see it immediately, but the Lord is constantly working in our lives. Let us pray that our prayer can transform our fears into courage, weakness into strength, uncertainty into confidence, loneliness into friendship. Try to pray as a family as it was said by the Rosary Crusader, Fr. Patrick Peyton, "the family that prays together, stays forever."
