FR. ADTODIO BAROL'S MESSAGE FOR SUDDAY - DOVEMBER 27TH, 2022

Dear sisters/brothers, parishioners of St. Thomas More and St. Bernadette,

I want to greet you using the letter of St. Paul to the Romans: "Brothers and sisters, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near." Every day we take in this journey of life is a step nearing our final destination and Jesus had warned us to be ready at all times for we do not know the time and the hour, it will come like a thief in the night. It is said that there are three comings of Jesus, he came to us when he was born in Bethlehem more than two thousand years ago, in the present time Jesus comes to us in many different ways, in the sacraments we encounter Christ when we hear the Scripture proclaimed in our hearing, when we receive Him in the Eucharist, when we encounter our sisters and brothers who are in need and in our aha moment when we see the beauty of God's creation we see his creating hands working at all time. And the third encounter is the moment that we come face to face with our God the creator, the Son who redeemed us and the Holy Spirit who is among us during our life's journey, when he will call us to rest in him.

Advent is remembering Jesus' first coming but when he ascended into heaven, he promised to be with us at all times therefore every day we encounter Jesus and let us make him our companion of the journey so that at the end of our journey he will call us to rest from all our labors and burden. This will be the time that we want to hear the words of our Savior and King, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Many times we find it hard to see the hand of God when we are surrounded with chaos and wars and disasters but Prophet Isaiah in the first reading is giving hope to the chosen people who were in exile and in the foreign land, yet he prophesied about the hope of the restoration of Judah and Jerusalem and peace will be in the land and the instruments of war will be turned into instruments to produce food.

It is said that the worst thing to be without is hope and hope ends when you stop believing.

Life is a continuous learning, and we should not stop learning and we should stop pretending that we know all because there is no more room for learning.

In this first Sunday of Advent let us listen to Jesus' warning and therefore let us keep awake and be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour. Let us also listen to St. Paul's message of laying aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light and live honourably. Again, let us use the three C plan, the choice the chance and the change and let us add one more C, our commitment to God who makes all things possible. It is my hope and prayer that part of our busy Christmas schedule is a time to attend mass because Christ is the reason of the season. Make him the center of all your plans.
