FR. ANTONIO BAROL'S MESSAGE FOR SUNDAY — APRIL 2ND, 2023

Dear sisters/brothers, parishioners of St. Thomas More and St. Bernadette,

As we come to the end of our Lenten journey let us call on God for his mercy and compassion by using Psalm 24; "Remember your compassion, O Lord, and your merciful love, for they are from of old. Let not our enemies exult over us. Redeem us, O God of Israel, from our distress." Our Lenten journey will end on the Easter Triduum which starts on Holy Thursday, the day when we remember Jesus instituting the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper until Easter Sunday when Christ rose from the dead. As we enter the holiest week this year let us try to equip ourselves with the different Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting/abstinence and works of charity. Let us look back to our journey and examine what are the things that we had planned at the start of Lent. Give praise to God if had you devotedly followed them, but if not, we still have one more week to go another mile spiritually. On Wednesday, we will have a penitential service at 5:00 PM to be followed by mass and then individual confession.

During Passion Sunday we read two gospel stories, at the beginning of the mass for the triumphant entry of Jesus to Jerusalem and the Passion of the Lord during the mass. Since we are in cycle A of the liturgical year, we will be reading the gospel according to St. Matthew. Let us take note, in the triumphant entry, the people already acclaimed him as the Son of David who comes in the name of the Lord. This is the Prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee. Jesus could have had used this opportunity that the people will rally behind him to avoid crucifixion, but it was not the plan of his heavenly Father. As St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Philippians, "He humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." This Passion Sunday we are given the grace to reflect on the greatest love of God to save humanity. First by sending his only Son, Jesus, and then Jesus offering himself as a ransom for many by his suffering, death, and resurrection. This way God had completed his promise to the chosen people to save the world. It is now for us to complete the work of redemption that learning from this Lenten journey, we may accomplish the task of salvation from being enslaved with worldly things we may see the beyond of our existence. As one of the prefaces in Lent says, "For you have given your children a sacred time for the renewing and purifying of their hearts, that, freed from the disordered affections, they may so deal with the things of this passing world as to hold rather to the things that eternally endure." Please, remember the different liturgical activities this Holy Week and try to make it holy by doing holy activities. Cont'd/ over Fr. Tony
